Barricade Types/Material **	Use
<p><b>Yellow Rope or Tape</b> <i>Or</i> <b>Yellow and Black Rope or Tape</b></p> <p><i>Having</i> -- Black and yellow “Caution” signs posted to identify the hazards and requirements for entering the barricaded area.</p>	<p>To form a barrier or barricade an area where hazardous condition exists.</p> <p><b>(Note:</b> Rope may be utilized as a permanent barricade for FBP work activities located within site buildings.)</p>
<p><b>Red Rope or Tape</b></p> <p><i>Having</i> -- Red, White, and Black “Danger” signs posted to identify the hazards and requirements for entering the barricaded area.</p>	<p>To form a barrier or barricade in an area where a serious safety hazard (one that could cause death or serious injury) exists and that must not be penetrated without authorization of the barricade erector.</p> <p>When exposed energized electrical conductors may be present see also FBP-OS-PRD-00001.</p>
<p><b>Orange Snow Fence</b></p> <p><i>Having</i> -- Black and Yellow “Caution” signs or Red, Black, and White “Danger” signs posted when used to identify hazards</p>	<p>Can be utilized to form a work zone barrier or for barricading identified safety hazards. Note: when this fencing type material is used to mark pathways or to protect sensitive property a sign is not required.</p>
<p><b>Metal Mesh Type Fence</b></p> <p><i>Having</i> -- Black and yellow “Caution” signs or red, black, and white “Danger” signs posted to identify hazards.</p>	<p>Minimum of 48 inches in height may be utilized in place of orange snow fence. Note: when this fencing type material is used to mark pathways or to protect sensitive property a sign is not required.</p>
<p><b>Portable Barricade</b></p> <p>Cones, tubular markers, barrels, Type 1, 2, or 3 Barricades</p>	<p>Can be utilized, if approved, by PSS and PORTS Fire Department to barricade any site roadway. Note: These marking devices may also be used to mark property and equipment to prevent damage.</p>

\*\*All barricade material **MUST** be able to withstand weather conditions if utilized outside

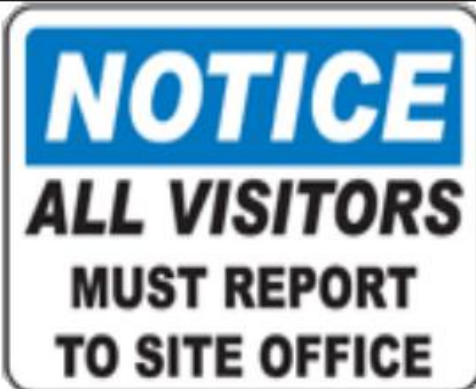


**DANGER** – Indicates immediate danger or hazardous situation which, if not avoided, will result in death or serious injury. Employees shall be instructed that danger signs indicate immediate danger and that special precautions are necessary. Prior to entering into an area delineated by Danger signs, all employees shall obtain permission for entry from the person or group who erected the barricade and signs. DANGER signs shall have red as the predominant color for the upper panel; black outline on the borders; and a white lower panel for additional sign wording. Examples of DANGER signs include “DANGER – High Voltage Authorization Personnel Only,” “DANGER – Open Excavation,” or “DANGER – No smoking, No Open Flames or Matches.”

When exposed energized electrical conductors may be present, see also FBP-OS-PRD-00001.



**CAUTION** – Caution signs shall be used to warn against potential hazards or to caution against unsafe practices. Employees shall be instructed that CAUTION signs shall have yellow as the predominant color; black upper panel and borders; yellow lettering of “CAUTION” on the black panel; and the lower yellow panel for additional sign wording. Black lettering shall be used for additional wording. Examples of CAUTION signs include “CAUTION – Hearing Protection Area,” “CAUTION – Watch your Step,” or “CAUTION – Watch For Forklifts.”



**NOTICE** – Indicates a statement of company policy directly or indirectly related to the safety of personnel or protection of property. NOTICE signs should not be associated with a hazard or hazardous situation and shall not be used in place of DANGER, CAUTION, or WARNING signs. NOTICE signs have a blue colored upper panel with white letters, and a bottom white panel with black letters. Examples of NOTICE signs include “NOTICE – Not an Exit,” “NOTICE – Keep this Door Closed,” or “NOTICE – No Eating or Drinking in This Area.”
